



# Caltrans Construction Notice



## Road Improvements on State Route 22



### WHAT

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will make improvements on State Route 22 (SR-22/7th St) in the city of Long Beach. Work will involve rehabilitating the pavement on both east- and westbound directions. Once the project is finished, motorists will experience a smoother drive.

Additional improvements include curb-ramp upgrades to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), installing new pedestrian push buttons, new loop detectors, and restriping.

### WHERE

East- and westbound SR-22 between PCH and San Gabriel River Bridge in Long Beach.

### WHEN

Construction will begin August 24, 2017 and continue through winter 2018. Curb-ramp upgrades will begin in August, pavement rehabilitation will begin October 2017.

*Note: Construction schedule is weather permitting and subject to change.*

### WHAT TO EXPECT

- Pedestrians will experience closures on various sidewalks while construction crews upgrade curb-ramps to meet ADA and install new pedestrian push buttons. Detours will be provided.
- When pavement rehabilitation begins, two lanes east- and westbound SR-22 will close intermittently. One lane in each direction will remain open at all times.
- Noise and vibration from construction activities is anticipated. Noise levels will not exceed state and federal guidelines.
