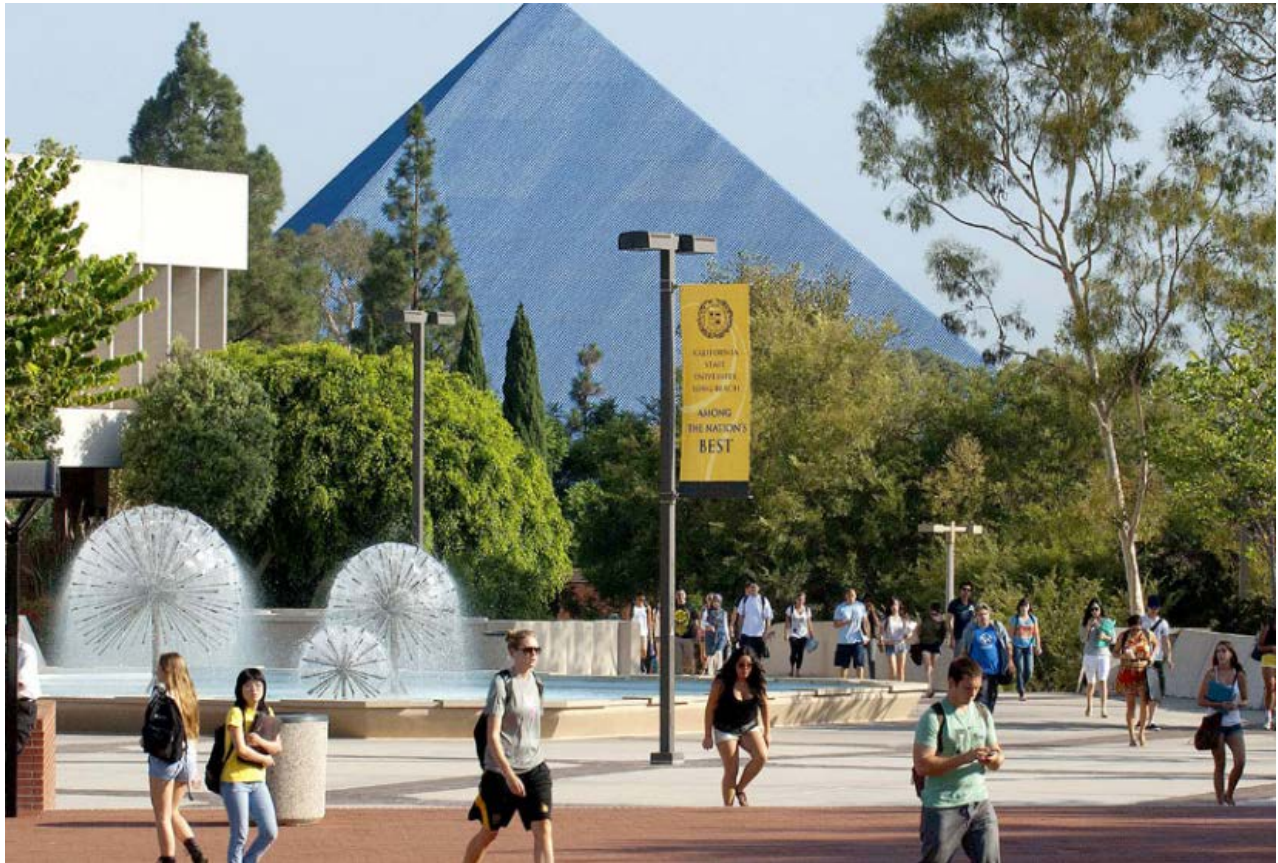




CALIFORNIA CAMPUS SAFETY PLAN 2017



California State University Long Beach is dedicated to ensure the University Community's right to a crime free environment through exemplary and professional service. The university police Department is committed to providing quality services to the University, to facilitate its academic and community service mission.

California State University, Long Beach Police Department prepares this report in compliance with California State Education Code, Chapter 16, of the Donahue Higher Education Act, Section 67380.

AVAILABILITY AND LOCATION OF SECURITY PERSONNEL

The University Police Department provides 24-hour service to protect and render aid to the University community. Students and employees can report all in-progress suspicious or criminal acts, all police, fire, and medical emergencies in person at the University Police Department at 1250 Bellflower Blvd. Long Beach California 90840. The police department is located off Palo Verde across from the wellness center. One can also call by phone; University Police Department at (562) 985-4101 or 911 in case of emergency. While we encourage all crimes to be reported to the University Police Department, an alternative reporting source for students is the Dean of Students. The Dean of Students can be contacted at (562) 985-8670 and is located in the Student Union room 215.

To Report a Crime:

- Provide your name, telephone number and location
- Give clear and accurate information
- Be prepared to supply suspect and vehicle description, and direction of travel
- DO NOT HANG UP! Follow the instructions of the Dispatcher

We have over 194 emergency blue light phones located across the campus. When the button is pushed, the blue strobe light flashes from the top of the phone tower, the University Police dispatcher is notified immediately and an officer is sent to the location of the telephone. No dialing or conversation is required. If possible, try to describe the emergency to the dispatcher. Any person who needs assistance, sees something suspicious or notices someone who needs assistance should activate a blue light phone that allows the person to speak directly with the University Police dispatcher.

SPECIAL SAFEGUARDS FOR FACILITIES OR ACTIVITIES

Security of and Access to Campus Facilities

All campus facilities are key-accessed and most are open daily for scheduled campus community use. Campus key control and distribution is a function of the University Facilities Department.

Security Considerations Used in Maintenance of Campus Facilities

University Police is responsible for security of all campus facilities. Personnel perform daily building lock-up of the majority of the campus buildings and monitor all maintenance issues in campus lighting, door locks and general environmental safety in conjunction with Facilities. A few buildings owned and controlled by Associated Students Incorporated and the Auxiliary Services Corporation utilize their own personnel to lock the buildings. Regular inspections and surveys of campus indoor and outdoor lighting, shrubbery and walkways are conducted. The University Police works in conjunction with Physical Planning and participates in Crime Prevention through Environmental Design concepts.

SECURITY AND CRIME PREVENTATION PROGRAMS

California State University Long Beach has developed an annual educational campaign consisting of presentations that include distribution of educational materials to new students, participating in and presenting information and materials during new employee orientation, and to other campus groups annually. University Police, Housing and Residential Life, Student Life and Development, Facilities Management, Student Health Services, and the Women's and Gender Equity Center all collaborate in programs offered periodically during the academic year to promote awareness and prevention throughout our community and surrounding areas. A member of CSULBPD is also part of the Project Safe Committee which is a program of prevention and intervention activities, including support and advocacy, to reduce the incidence of sexual assault, relationship violence and stalking on the CSULB campus. University Police also participates as a member of the Title-IX Committee. University Police offers Rape Aggression Defense System (RAD) training each semester. It is a comprehensive course that awareness, prevention, risk reduction and avoidance, while progressing onto the basics of hands-on defense training. Certified RAD instructors will teach the courses provided. University Police personnel also facilitate programs for student, parent, and residential staff employee orientations, and student organizations, providing a variety of educational strategies and tips on how to protect themselves from sexual assault, theft and other crimes. Active Shooter Response training is also presented to various components of our campus community upon request and annually during Health & Safety Week.

ACTIONS IN THE LAST 18 MONTHS TO INCREASE SAFETY

1. Installed an exterior public address system to compliment and improve the effectiveness of the Beach Alert Emergency Notification System.
2. Initiated a project to change the door lock hardware on classrooms to enable the door to be locked from the inside without a key to meet ADA standards.
3. Improved the enrollment process of the Beach Alert Emergency Notification System to more effectively communicate with the campus community in the event of an emergency.
4. Shelter in Place drills on campus. This is part of the Run-Hide-Fight program for active shooter
5. Provide multiple safety workshops and trainings on topics including sexual assault prevention, alcohol poisoning, bystander intervention, healthy relationships, violence prevention, active shooter response, fire safety, and personal safety.
6. Infrastructure data base; CalCOP system enables the user to access critical infrastructure information relevant to buildings on campus. This information assists in the detailing of critical need deployment in time of emergency for emergency personnel.

CHANGES IN SAFETY PRECAUTIONS DURING THE NEXT 24 MONTHS

1. Continue to upgrade the door lock hardware on classrooms to enable the door to be locked from the inside without a key in support of safety concerns in an active shooter situation.
2. Install surveillance cameras in the Beachside Residential Housing complex.
